Equipment Violation Leads to Drug Arrest—

Early morning on October 10th, an Owatonna officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. As the officer initiated the stop, the vehicle slowed but did not stop right away—the officer observed the driver making furtive movements to the passenger side of the car. The vehicle finally came to a stop and the officer met with the driver and passenger. The driver did not have any identification with him but identified himself by name and date of birth.

The officer was familiar with the driver by name and knew he had outstanding felony warrants and detained the driver. Our narcotic detecting canine, Vegas, conducted a sniff of the vehicle and alerted to the presence of narcotics in the vehicle—.8 grams of presumptive methamphetamine was found between the passenger seat and center console. In addition, 5 1/2 pills of suspected Ecstasy were located in the vehicle. Brian Maestre-Revis

The 2019 Annual Report serves as a reflection of the events, operations and significant investigations the Owatonna Police Department

was arrested and has been charged with two counts of 5th Degree Possession of a Controlled Substance and 4th Degree DWI. During a statement, Maestre-Rivas admitted to using meth earlier that day and failed roadside field sobriety testing.

Sober Cabbie Arrested for DWI—

Early on October 11th, a patrol officer stopped a vehicle for a lane violation near West Park Square and Main Street. When meeting with the female driver, she indicated she was sober cabbie. She

indicated she had two beers and feel[s] good to drive. The officer noted signs of intoxication and had her perform road-side field sobriety testing which indicated she wasn't so good to drive, and she was placed under arrest for suspicion of DWI. The driver later provided an evidentiary breath test which reported a breath alcohol content of .18, or over twice the legal limit of .08. Nicole Buck, age 25 of Ellendale, has been charged with two counts of 2nd Degree DWI. In a later statement, Buck indicated she drank 4-Budweisers and 3-shots in a 90-minute period.

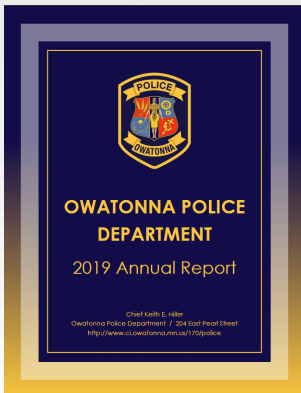

Police Officer Jonathan Shoop was shot and killed during a traffic stop. The suspect fled the scene, struck a pedestrian, and then crashed. The suspect then opened fire on the officers, killing Officer Shoop and wounding another officer before fleeing on foot. The suspect was later apprehended. Officer Shoop is the 31st law enforcement officer to be shot and killed this year and the second officer fatality from the state of Washington in 2020.
