## Winter Driving Advisory—

This past week the light dusting of snow we received created some hazardous driving conditions in places, evidenced by a few crashes in town where ice-covered roads were a contributing factor to the crash. A major winter snow event is way overdue, so remember these tips:

- Slow down to safe speeds for the current road conditions—road conditions may change very quickly
- Avoid unnecessary travel if road conditions are poor
- Check current road conditions at [511mn.org](http://511mn.org)
- Stay alert for snow plows and give them room—stay 5 car lengths behind the plow
- Be prepared with a winter survival kit
- Buckle up and ensure children are properly secured in the correct child restraint



## Walking After Dark—

Many people, including this writer, are taking advantage of wonderful weather and road conditions and are out walking—often in the early morning or after work and in the dark.

Please remember to help protect yourself and wear light/bright colored clothing to help motorists see you. You may want to consider investing in some gear to keep you visible, such as a headlamp, reflective clothing or LED lighted vests, arm or ankle bands. Lastly, don't assume motorists see you—keep your head up and be alert to oncoming traffic or when crossing streets or at intersections.
