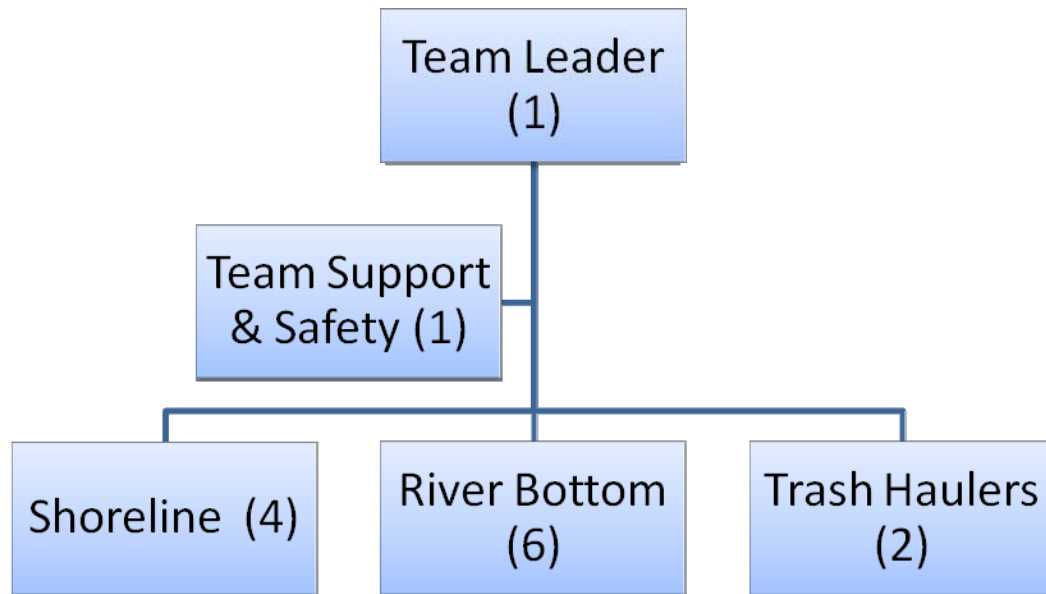


Owatonna Site River Cleanup Team Structure



Team Leader

- a. Ensuring that all volunteers in their group are safe and accounted for.
 - b. Contact with Cleanup Site leader via radio.
 - c. Strong leadership and direction of volunteers with personal communication.
 - d. Participate in the cleanup effort and not just oversee from the shore.
 - e. Keep volunteers motivated and happy during cleanup effort.
- 2. Team Support & Safety**
 - a. Ensure volunteers are well hydrated and not exhausted.
 - b. Readily have first aid materials on hand for volunteers as needed.
 - c. Support the volunteers in any way possible and feasible during the cleanup.
- 3. Shoreline**
 - a. Walk along the shoreline picking up debris, not down in water.
 - b. Assist Trash Haulers/River Bottom volunteers in getting debris out of water.
 - c. Wear long pants for walking in brush.
- 4. River Bottom**
 - a. Walk in the river bottom, feeling for debris under water.
 - b. May include some heavy lifting.
 - c. Debris should be loaded into boats or hauled up on shore.
 - d. Wear shorts and old tennis shoes, no flip flops.
- 5. Trash Haulers**
 - a. Collect all debris collected and haul back to central dump site.
 - b. Trash Haulers should have a pick up or trailer to use to haul debris.
 - c. Sort trash for metal and load into dumpsters.
