lighting a fire and keep it open until the ashes are cool.

- Store fireplace ashes in a fire resistant container, cover it with a lid, and keep the container outdoors and away from combustibles.
- Place space heaters on a level, hard and nonflammable surface such as a ceramic tile floor—not on rugs or carpets.
- Keep space heaters at least 3 feet from bedding, drapes, furniture and other flammable materials.
- Keep children and pets away from space heaters.
- Never leave a space heater on when you go to sleep or place a space heater near a sleeping person.
- Turn space heaters off when you leave an area.
- Use a space heater that has been tested to the latest safety standards and certified by a nationally-recognized testing laboratory (an unvented gas space heater that meets current

safety standards will shut off if oxygen levels fall too low).

- Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents or campers, even if ventilation is provided. ♦

### Water Heaters Recalled

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has announced the recall of approximately 3,000 "Delta Performance" and "Delta Performance Plus" combination water heaters manufactured by Triangle Tube/Phase III, of Blackwood, New Jersey.

The water heaters are white and rectangular in shape, and have "Delta" printed on the front and "Triangle Tube" printed on the control panel. The burner plate and flue hood seal of the recalled heaters can fail due to an improper seal, causing a leak of flue gases and carbon monoxide. Models PG-25, PG-30, PG-35, PG-40, PG-45, PG PLUS-25, PG PLUS-30, PG PLUS-35, PG PLUS-40 and PG PLUS-45 with serial numbers

1148 through 6203 (located on the rating plate on either the front or the right side) are included in the recall.

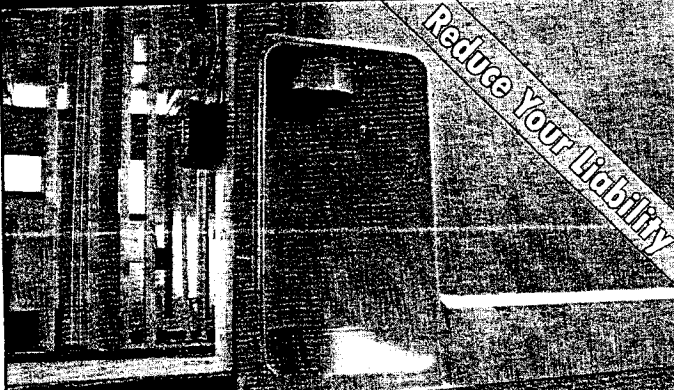
The units were sold by plumbing and heating wholesale companies to independent plumbing and heating contractors from August 2001 to January 2006 for about \$3,500. Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled water heaters and contact Triangle Tube at 1-800-856-6271 or visit the company's website at [www.triangletube.com](http://www.triangletube.com) to schedule a free repair. ♦

### Boilers Recalled

The CPSC has announced the recall of approximately 16,000 Weil-McLain Ultra Series Gas Boilers manufactured by Weil-McLain of Michigan City, Indiana.

The boilers were manufactured for use with natural gas but could have a blue tag incorrectly indicating to installers that they are intended for use with liquid propane (LP) gas. If con-

nected to LP gas without installing a conversion kit, carbon monoxide can build up due to incomplete combustion, posing a risk of poisoning.

The recall involves Weil-McLain Ultra 80, Ultra 105, Ultra 155, Ultra 230 and Ultra 310 boilers with serial numbers CP5071716 through CP5327000. The floor- or wall-mounted boilers are wrapped in a glossy silver/flat black jacket and have "Weil-McLain" printed on the front panel, which must be removed to view the label on which the serial number is printed.

The units were sold by plumbing and heating wholesale distributors to plumbers and contractors nationwide from May 2005 through July 2006 for between \$4,000 and \$7,000. Consumers who had a Weil-McLain Ultra series boiler installed for use with propane should contact the installer or a heating professional for a free safety inspection. If the boiler was not installed with a

propane conversion kit, one will be installed at the time of the inspection at no charge.

### CAI-NJ and Habitat Partner

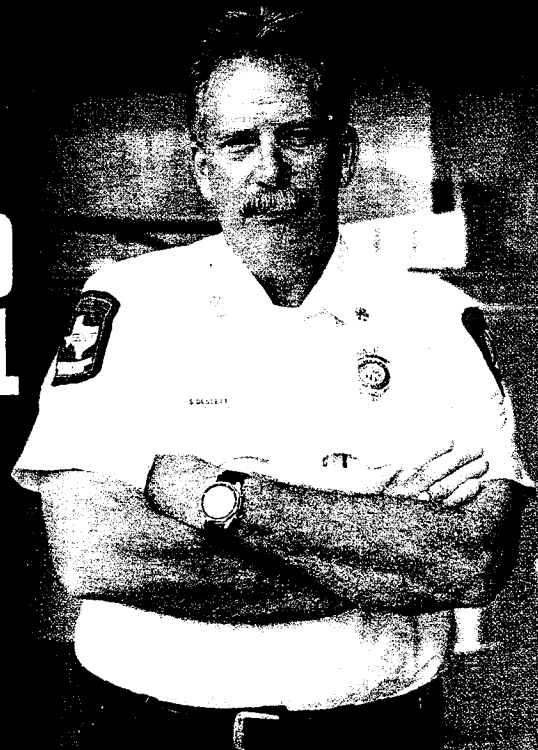
